## General Education Assessment and Improvement: Information Literacy

The most recent large-scale General Education Information Literacy assessment was conducted in 2019-20 and a follow-up assessment was conducted in 2022-23. The first column below includes results of that assessment for students who earned $45+$ credit hours vs. all students who took the assessment. Additional demographic information was also reviewed.

The second column includes related assessment information to provide additional information regarding students' achievement of this outcome, including one item from the Community College Survey of Student Engagement (CCSSE) that provides indirect assessment evidence related to the Information Literacy outcome.

Based on the results of the 2019-20 assessment, the Learning Assessment Committee and General Education-Information Literacy Work Group worked to improve Information Literacy across Harper College. The Information Literacy Improvement Plan can be found here.
