EIT: E-Learning and Instructional Technology

These courses introduce students to e-learning development and instructional technology.

The field of developing e-learning for schools and corporate training is growing along with the increase in distance learning. EIT courses help to prepare students for jobs in this area. Educators may also find these courses useful to enhance their courses and facilitate communication with students.

EIT Course Listings

Course	Title
EIT 200	E-Learning Tools & Technology Provides the student with a foundation in the tools and technologies used to develop and support e-learning in business and education environments. Prerequisite: CIS 100 or CIS 101 with a grade of "C" or better OR consent of instructor
EIT 220	E-Learning Instructional Systems Design Provides a foundation in instructional design principles utilized to create e-learning content for adult learners. Prerequisite: EIT 200 with a grade of "C" or better
EIT 250	E-Learning Web Development Continues the study of e-learning and instructional design as students build instructional modules for the Web. Emphasizes design, presentation, and interactivity to create engaging e-learning experiences for adult learners. Prerequisite: EIT 220, WEB 150, and WEB 180 with a grade of "C" or better
EIT 280	E-Learning Development & Management Applies and integrates instructional design skills from previous e-learning courses. E-learning and instructional technology management issues and instructional system development life cycle methodologies are discussed and practiced. Prerequisite: EIT 250 with a grade of "C" or better
