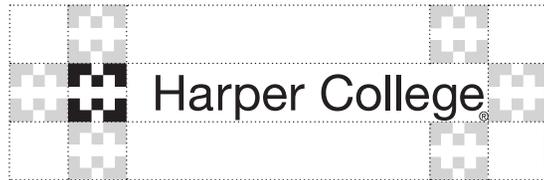


USING THE LOGO

Consistent and proper use of the logo strengthens recognition of Harper College and reinforces its reputation for quality.

Give the logo its own space

A clear space equal to or greater than the width of the Harper symbol  around the logo will give it room to stand out.



Logo Placement

In general, the logo should be placed in the upper-left or lower-right corner of a document. When body copy is centered on a page, the logo may be placed centered, as well.

The Harper symbol  should not be used by itself without the approval from the Creative Services Manager at 847.925.6138 or email standards@harpercollege.edu

Minimum Size

For clarity, the logo should not be printed smaller than 1¾ wide. The ® should never be used when the logo is printed minimum size.



OFFICIAL COLORS

Harper College's official colors are Harper blue, (PMS 288)* and Harper silver, (PMS 877 metallic silver). Gray (PMS 422) may be substituted for the silver.

When using four-color process to print, please use the CMYK builds specified with each color swatch.

SECONDARY **COLOR PALETTE**

The secondary colors shown below are available to use strictly as an accent to the official blue (PMS 288)* and official silver (PMS 877). However, the official blue, gray or combination of the two should always act as the primary colors. A secondary color should never take

precedence over the College’s official blue or silver. It is recommended that communications from the College contain at least 30% Harper blue or a combination of Harper blue and Harper silver/gray.

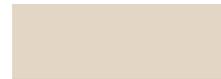
