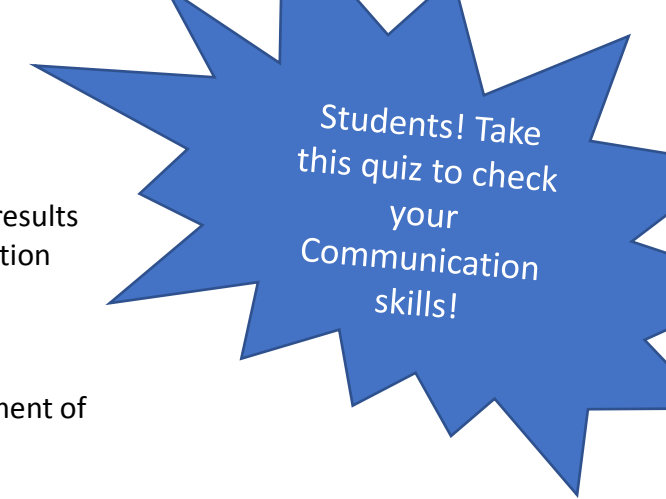

General Education Assessment and Improvement: Communication

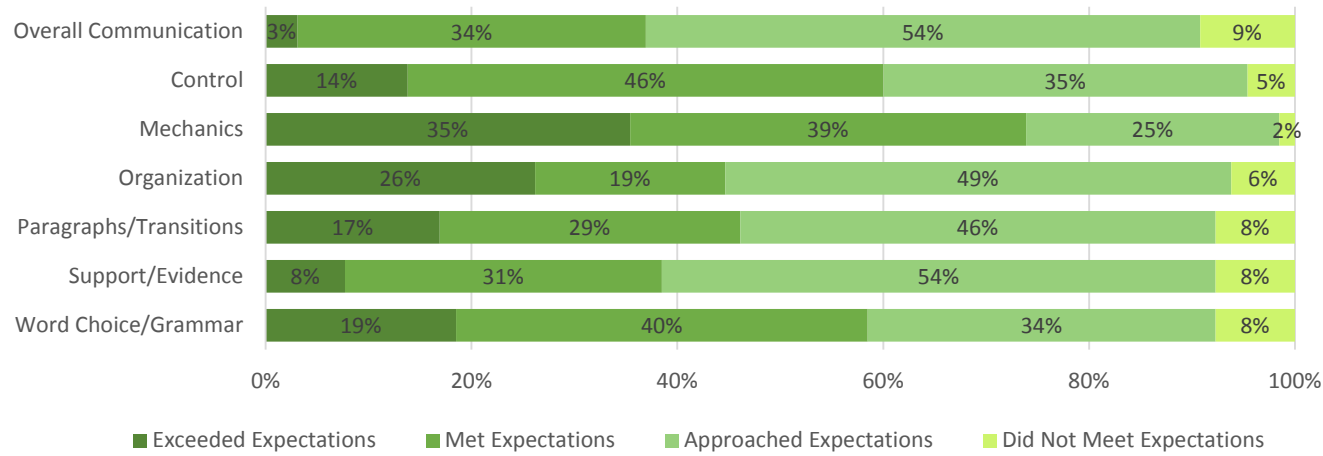


The most recent large-scale General Education Communication assessment was conducted in 2013-14. The first column below includes results of that assessment for students who earned 45+ credit hours vs. all students who took the assessment. Additional demographic information was also reviewed. A follow-up assessment was conducted in spring 2017, and the next large-scale General Education Communication assessment is planned for 2018-19.

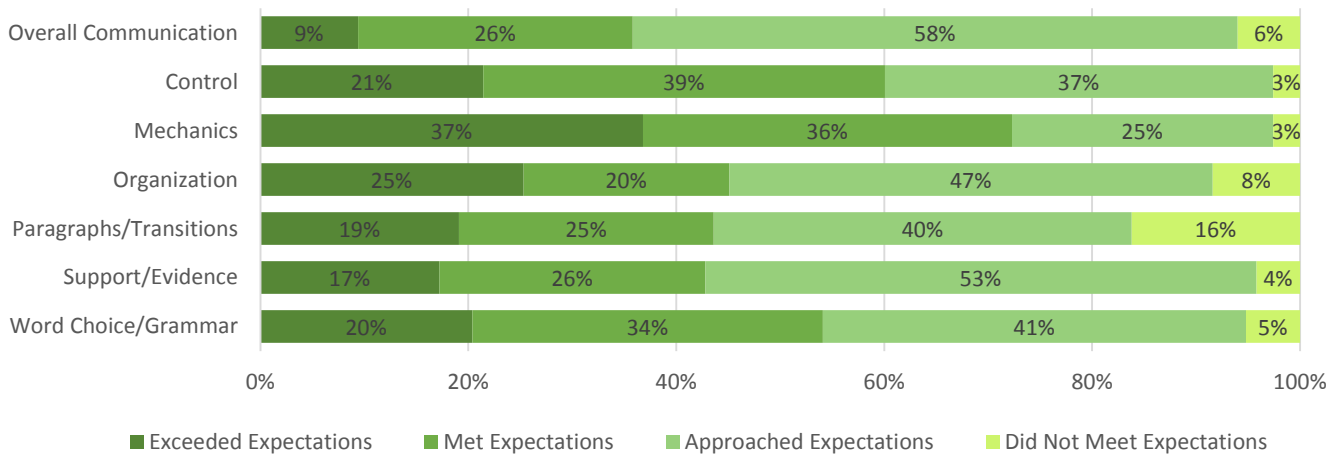
Additionally, the second column includes related assessment information to provide additional information regarding students' achievement of this outcome. The Community College Survey of Student Engagement (CCSSE) is being administered again in spring 2018.

Direct Assessment Scores, 45+ Hours

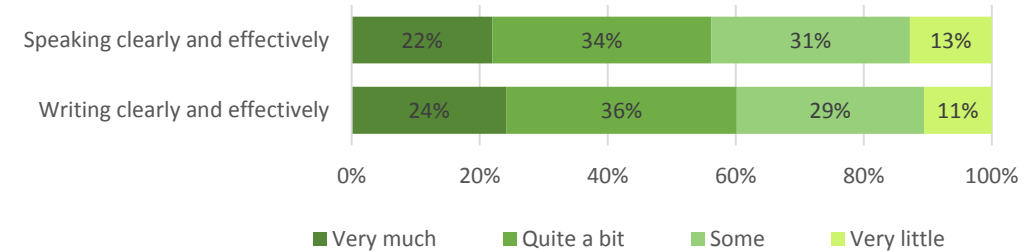


Direct Assessment Scores, All Student Groups



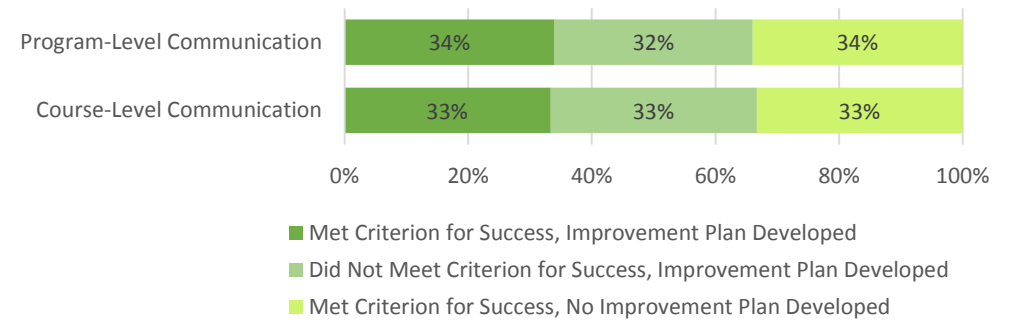
