## **General Education Assessment and Improvement: Information Literacy**

The most recent large-scale General Education Information Literacy assessment was conducted in 2014-15. The first column below includes results of that assessment for students who earned 45+ credit hours vs. all students who took the assessment. Additional demographic information was also reviewed. A follow-up assessment is being conducted in spring 2018.

The second column includes related assessment information to provide additional information regarding students' achievement of this outcome. The Community College Survey of Student Engagement (CCSSE) is being administered again in spring 2018.

Based on these results, the Learning Assessment Committee and General Education—Information Literacy Work Group are working to improve Information Literacy across Harper College. <u>The Information Literacy Improvement Plan can be found here.</u>




