# **Submit the (PNC) Program Application**

## **Program Requirements**

### 1) Illinois Health Care worker Registry – active as a Certified Nursing Assistant

- You must provide proof of your having passed the Illinois State CNA registry exam and have <u>current</u> <u>registry</u> status (within the <u>past 2 years</u>) and/or actively employed under the Employment Verification section on the registry. Go to <a href="http://www.idph.state.il.us/nar/home.htm">http://www.idph.state.il.us/nar/home.htm</a> to print a copy of your registry from the Illinois Department of Public Health web site.
- If you are not current according to the above criteria, you may be able to recertify please use this link for information https://www.nurseaidetesting.com/recertification-process/
- If you are enrolled in a CNA course, you must complete the course(s) with a C or better and pass the licensure exam and be listed on the Illinois Dept of Public Health Care Registry by the deadlines below:
  - o Spring applicants must be on the registry by December 19<sup>th</sup>
  - Fall applicants must be on the registry by July 1<sup>st</sup>

#### 2) Harper Grade Point Average (if courses taken at Harper)

• Current or previously enrolled Harper students must have a minimum **2.0 grade point average** at the time of application. **If your GPA is below a 2.0, your application cannot be processed.** 

#### 3) English - Placement into ENG101

Can be satisfied by one of the following options below. Please check the Testing webpage <a href="https://www.harpercollege.edu/testing/english-placement-grid.php">https://www.harpercollege.edu/testing/english-placement-grid.php</a> full list of options.

- Completion of ENG 101 (or higher-level English course) at Harper with a grade of C or better
- ACT English score of 19 or higher AND ACT Reading score of 20 or higher
- SAT Evidence-based Reading & Writing score of 480 or higher
- Cumulative unweighted high school GPA of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale or 4.0 or higher on a 5.0 scale (7<sup>th</sup> semester or later HS transcript)
- Harper's English placement exam with a score of 4 or higher
- Completion of the appropriate ESL courses that satisfy placement into ENG 101
- GED score of 165 or higher on reasoning through language arts sub-section, completed in English
- Passing grade ("C-" or better) in an aligned English course administered at a participating district 211,
   214, and 220 high schools.

There is no time limit on the English requirement.

4) <u>Math Assessment</u> – demonstrate college level placement in mathematics with one of the testing or course options below. There is "no time limit" on any of the following for NUR admissions. But time limits do apply to register for course work.

- **5)** Official High School Transcript OR High School Equivalency (HSE) Results The final high school transcript must have the graduation date posted; the HSE report must show passing scores.
- Applicants who have completed high school in another country need a document-to-document evaluation of their high school transcript completed by Educational Credential Evaluators (ECE) www.ece.org or World Education Services (WES) www.wes.org stating U.S. Equivalence: High school diploma.
- This high school transcript requirement can be waived if official documentation is provided demonstrating completion of the equivalent of a U.S. associate or higher degree.

<u>Re-entry Permission</u> – If you were previously enrolled in either of Harper's nursing programs and were unsuccessful, department permission is required for re-entry.

## Courses are not required but if completed must be within the past 5 years

BIO 260 (160) – HUMAN ANATOMY	Must be completed after January 1, 2021
BIO 261 (161) – HUMAN PHYSIOLOGY	Must be completed after January 1, 2021

## **Admission Decisions**

### Satisfaction of all requirements does not guarantee acceptance to the program, space is limited.

- Applications will be processed within 5 10 business days. Students will receive an email to the email
  on the application and/or their Harper email stating if their file is complete or if there are outstanding
  items. A complete file does not guarantee acceptance, but students with complete files will have
  priority over those with items outstanding.
- Decision emails will be sent within 3 weeks of the application closing date to all applicants.
- Students with a complete file by the application deadline will be given priority for admissions.
- NOT REQUIRED Students who have completed the first semester courses (not required) BIO260 Human Anatomy, ENG101 English Composition and PSY101 Introduction to Psychology may be eligible to start the 2<sup>nd</sup> semester NUR courses in Spring 2026 pending availability. Those students will be ranked according to the following chart.

<sup>\*</sup>If BIO260 Human Anatomy is taken more than 2 times unsuccessfully withing the 5 year time limit, no points will be awarded. Example W/F/B = 0 points.

#### **Submit Additional Documentation**

Note: Official documents are those sent directly from the institution to Harper College (emails are not official)

<u>Official College Transcripts</u> – You will need to submit transcripts from other colleges attended if the documents show completion of coursework you think may fulfill course admission requirements or support coursework applicable to the Harper College Practical Nursing Certificate Program. Transcripts should be sent to processing@harpercollege.edu.

- Foreign college transcripts must first be evaluated by World Education Services (wes.org) or Educational Credential Evaluators, INC (ece.org).
- To learn if/how credits from other colleges will transfer to Harper, applicants must have an official
  transcript sent from each college or university attended. Official transcripts will be evaluated as they
  are received, and students will receive an email to their Harper email account when the evaluation is
  completed.

# **Important Notes**

- Students will be admitted based on residency (Harper in district and those whose home college does not offer an LPN/PNC program receive priority). Residency is based on the address listed on your Harper account working in district is NOT considered in district for residency purposes.
- It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure all requirements are met and all documentation is on file.
- Accepted applicants must be 18 years of age before the program starts.
- All correspondence regarding your application will be emailed to the address given on your application and your Harper email address. It is your responsibility to see that your address information is current.
   To update your addresses (and/or phone number), you will need to contact the One Stop Center,
   Building A, Room A250.
- Official transcripts will be evaluated as they are received, and students will receive an email to their Harper email account when they have been evaluated. Results can be viewed online through the student portal. Transcript evaluations may take 3 4 weeks to process. Questions about transcript evaluations can be sent to evaluation@harpercollege.edu.
- Once your program application has been processed, you will be able to monitor your limited enrollment file online. Go to harpercollege.edu and log into your My Harper Student Portal; limited enrollment information can be found under the Registration and Records section.
- It is very important that you make financial aid preparations well in advance of any deadlines so that you know exactly what resources are available to you.
