Submit College Application and Fee

- If you have not previously applied to the College, this is your first step.

Submit the HIT Program Application

Eligibility to Submit the Health Information Technology Application:

- Your Harper College Application must already be on file
- Complete the online, on-demand HIT Program Overview Module <u>including quiz</u> at: https://forms.gle/5K11TJnYSSusNDYi6
 - Quiz scores are valid only for the current application cycle. This quiz may be repeated once and the higher score of your two attempts will be counted. Each correct answer is worth 1 point for a maximum of 10 points.
- You must choose either full-time or part-time cohort. Once you have been admitted you cannot switch between cohorts without contacting the coordinator, Paula Akialis at: <u>pakialis@harpercollege.edu</u>

Submit Additional Documentation

Note: Official documents are those sent directly from the institution to Harper College.

<u>Official High School Transcript OR GED Results</u> - The final high school transcript must have the graduation date posted, or the GED report must show passing scores.

- Applicants who have completed high school in another country need to submit a document-to-document evaluation of their high school transcript completed by Educational Credential Evaluators, INC (ECE) www.ece.org or World Education Services (WES) www.wes.org stating U.S. Equivalence: High school diploma.
- This high school transcript requirement can be waived if official documentation is provided demonstrating completion of the equivalent of a U.S. associate or higher degree.

<u>Official College Transcripts</u> – You will need to submit transcripts from other colleges if transfer credit is necessary.

- Requests can be made at the institution website or https://www.studentclearinghouse.org/students/.
- Foreign college transcripts must first be evaluated by World Education Services (wes.org) or Educational Credential Evaluators, INC (ece.org). A copy of the completed course-by-course WES or ECE evaluation must be submitted to the processing@harpercollege.edu.
- To learn if/how credits from other colleges will transfer to Harper, applicants must have an
 official transcript from each college or university attended sent to the Admissions Processing
 Office (processing@harpercollege.edu) upon being admitted to the College. Official
 transcripts will be evaluated after they have been received and students will be sent an email
 to their Harper email account with transfer credit information.

Program Prerequisites Must be completed by the program application deadline date

Harper Grade Point Average

• Current or previously enrolled Harper students must have a minimum 2.0 grade point average.

<u>English / Reading Placement</u> – placement into ENG 101 at Harper College, or the equivalent from another college (as determined by the Harper College transcript evaluation).

- ACT English score of 19 or higher, and ACT Reading score of 20 or higher, or
- SAT English/Reading score of 480 or higher, or
- Harper College Writing/Reading Assessment Test resulting in placement into ENG 101 without a reading co-requisite, or
- ENG 100 or higher level at Harper with a grade of "C" or better, or
- ENG 101 transfer credit
- There is no expiration date on the English Composition course or testing requirement for this program; however, testing rules apply if you are planning to register for an English course

<u>Math Assessment</u> - demonstrate college level placement in mathematics with one of the testing or course options below.

- ACT math score of 22 or higher, or
- SAT math score of 530 or higher, or
- Intermediate Algebra or higher math course at Harper College or at another appropriately accredited college with a grade of "C" or better, or
- Harper College Math Assessment Test resulting in placement into a college level math course (MTH 101, 103, or higher level)
- There is no expiration date for the math course or testing requirement for this program; however, testing rules apply if you are planning to register for a math course

Re-entry Permission

• If you were previously enrolled in the program, departmental permission is required for reentry. Without this department approval, your file will remain incomplete.

Admission Decisions

- All applicants will be sent a decision regarding their status in the program; however, satisfaction of admission requirements does not guarantee acceptance.
- Applicants whose files are complete prior to the program deadline date and have a quiz score
 of 9 or 10 will receive an email with instructions on how to accept their seat as well as
 information regarding the mandatory online welcome and orientation sessions
- Applicants whose files are incomplete will have until the published deadline date to complete their files.
- An email will be sent to the email address you have provided on the application and your Harper College email address. Please check spam folders for personal email addresses.

Important Admission Notes

- Once your program application has been processed, you will be able to monitor your application-based file online. Go to harpercollege.edu and log into your MyHarper Student Portal; information can be found under the Registration and Records section.
- All admission requirements must be met by the program application deadline date. It is the
 applicant's responsibility to ensure that all requirements have been met and all
 documentation is on file.
- You will receive an email regarding your application status within 5-7 business days after submitting it.
- Students who apply for this application-based program are obligated to meet current
 admission requirements and follow the program curriculum as defined at the time of
 acceptance into the program. This includes the requirement to follow either the full-time or
 part-time cohort course sequence.
- Accepted applicants will be required to undergo a criminal background check. Information regarding these requirements will be discussed at orientation.
- A new application will need to be submitted for a future term if the candidate is not selected or does not start the program if admitted.
