What is Virtual Exchange?

"Virtual Exchange is a practice, supported by research, that consists of sustained, technology-enabled, people-to-people education programmes or activities in which constructive communication and interaction take place between individuals or groups who are geographically separated and/or from different cultural backgrounds, with the support of educators or facilitators. Virtual Exchange combines the deep impact of intercultural dialogue and exchange with the broad reach of digital technology." (EVOLVE). There are two routes for virtual exchange at Harper:

- Virtual exchanges within existing Harper courses
- Virtual exchanges that students can participate independently of Harper courses



The list of professors and classes that offer virtual exchange is always changing, so stay connected with our office to receive updates.

Below you will find virtual exchange opportunities that are independent of Harper courses.

Virtual Internship: Barcelona SAE

Barcelona SAE is a leader in this lively Spanish city. It offers 6, 8, or 12 weeks during the Fall + Spring Semesters and 6 or 8 weeks during the Summer. Students are matched with a Spanish company through a personalized placement process. The hours are



flexible, as students will be working on projects and checking in with their supervisor in set meetings to report on their progress. During the program, there are also meetings with a Barcelona SAE staff for guided reflection and coaching to help keep students on the path to understanding the cultural, professional, and logistical pieces of work-life in Barcelona.

All companies that host a remote internship on this program are based in Spain and available in Spanish or English. Fields include:

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Virtual Internship: EDU Africa



This program is an 8-week, project-based internship experience placing students on small global teams with host companies in Africa seeking to address a business problem related to sustainability across the world.

The program will run from September 26 to November 16, with meetings on Mondays and Wednesdays from 9 am to 11 am. The cost for this program varies if you choose to receive credit for it or not. 
STUDENT TESTIMONIAL

STUDENT TESTIMONIAL

Twent to Costa Rica for a month in the Summer ICISP program. I studied at a college called Costa Rica Language Academy. My program was language based, to learn the language. We met Monday through Thursday, from 9 am to 2 pm, with a one-hour lunch break. We were all tested on the first day and placed at the level that met our proficiency. Once or twice a week, we also had excursions exploring other cities and historical sites.

Learning a language in an immersive setting was very different than in the US. We learned grammar and vocabulary, but it was more centered on topics to talk about, and the class would develop from there. It was a feeling of "you have to rise to the occasion". As they (local people, teachers) keep talking, you just kind of pick it up and start being able to express yourself and give your opinions instead of having a structured presentation or working from a workbook. It was learning how to use the language rather than from a book.

Overall, I learned from this experience to step out of my comfort zone. This experience was very different than what I am used to. I had never been away from my family for more than two weeks or on a plane. When I got there, there were a lot of cultural shocks: everything there was different! The clothes were different, the way people drove was different, everything! And I was kind of in shock at first, but I learned the importance of that shock. And the importance of putting yourself in a situation that you are not that comfortable with because only then I was able to open myself to that much growth."


