# Fall 2025 Paramedic Program Application Dates March 1, 2025—June 17, 2025\*

Program Start.....September 8, 2025

\*June 17, 2025 is the application deadline; all required documents must be submitted to Harper College by that date. (Last exam date available is June 12th)

#### STEP I

#### Schedule and take the EMT Validation Exam

- Applicants must demonstrate minimally acceptable EMT knowledge through written pretesting to be accepted into the paramedic class. Contact Pamela Ross at 847-618-4482 or email pross@nch.org beginning March 1, 2025, to obtain the Validation Exam blueprint via email along with the pre-test registration instructions. Testing will be conducted on May 21<sup>st</sup>, May 29, June 4<sup>th</sup>, and June 12<sup>th</sup> at 9 AM by appointment. Students scheduled for the last testing date of June 12<sup>th</sup> are not able to retest.
  Questions about the exam can be answered at 847-618-4482.
- A score of 80% or higher is passing. Applicants have one opportunity to retake the exam if their score is less than 80% on the first attempt to ensure eligibility for acceptance. First attempt scores are weighed in the rank order for class acceptance.
- Applicants who receive a score of **80%** or higher on the pretest will receive the following from the EMS Office at Northwest Community Hospital.

#### Paramedic Program Application and need for Supporting Documents

Submit the following to Pamela Ross at Northwest Community Hospital's EMS Office BEFORE submitting the application for the Paramedic Program to Harper College:

- Proof of meeting minimum age requirement of 18 years: Copy of driver's license, passport, or state ID
- Current driver's license
- Current EMT or AEMT license
- Current American Heart Association CPR for Healthcare Professionals card.
- The Paramedic Program Supplemental Information Form

#### STEP II

#### Complete and submit the Paramedic Program application:

Once you have successfully passed the EMT validation exam with a score of 80% or higher you will receive the link to the Harper College Paramedic Program online application. Complete all fields. Your application will be processed within 5 – 7 business days. Application status will be emailed to you at the email address provided on the application as well as to your Harper College email address.

NOTE: Please check your spam folder as some emails (g-mail, yahoo) may go to spam. Submit all documents to Harper College by June 17, 2025.

#### Other prerequisites

## Official High School Transcript OR High School Equivalency (HSE) Results MANDATORY (regardless of higher degree)

- Send your official final high school transcripts with the graduation date posted, or, if you are submitting the HSE report, the document must show passing scores. Either document should be sent **directly** from the institution to Harper College.
  - ➤ The preferred method to send your official transcript is electronically via Parchment or eScrip-Safe.

Applicants who have completed high school in another country will need to submit a
document-to-document evaluation of their high school transcript completed by Educational
Credential Evaluators, INC (ECE) <a href="www.ece.org">www.ece.org</a> or World Education Services (WES)
<a href="www.wes.org">www.wes.org</a> <a href="mailto:specifically">specifically</a> stating: U.S. Equivalence: High school diploma.

#### **English/Reading Placement** – can be satisfied by one of the following options:

- ACT English score of 19 or higher and ACT Reading score of 20 or higher; or
- SAT Evidence-based Reading and Writing subscore of 480 or higher or
- Harper College Writing/Reading Assessment Test results that demonstrate placement into ENG 101 without a reading co-requisite; or
- Successful completion of a college level English composition transfer course equivalent to ENG 101 at Harper with a grade of "C" or better
- Aligned high school ENG course with a grade of C or higher from districts 211, 214, or 220, or
- Successful completion of a college level, Harper College ENG Dual Credit course, or
- Advanced Placement credit with a score of 3 or higher, or
- Cumulative unweighted high school GPA of 3.0 (on a 4-point scale) or 4.0 (on a 5-pt scale)

#### **Academic Standing**

- Current or previously enrolled Harper students must have a minimum 2.0 grade point average (GPA).
- Applications will not be processed for applicants who do not have a 2.0 GPA (no exceptions).

#### STEP III

#### **Admission Selection Decisions**

- This is a Limited Enrollment Program. Once all required documents are submitted and all admission requirements are satisfied, your name will be forwarded to the NCH EMS Office.
- Class enrollment is mutually determined by NCH and Harper College representatives shortly
  after the deadline date for those whose Harper paramedic program files are complete by June
  17, 2025. Passing the validation exam, submitting the application, and satisfying all admission
  requirements with a completed file will result in an admission decision. However, completing
  these steps will not guarantee acceptance into the program. The number of students selected
  depends on the availability of field internship and hospital clinical opportunities, classroom
  space, and required student-instructor ratios.
- Applicants who have satisfied all requirements and are employed by and assigned to vehicles in the NWC EMSS with verified preceptors will have priority in the selection process.
- Unaffiliated students are selected based on EMT Validation Exam score rank order starting
  with the highest first attempt scores. Other considerations may include complete file
  submission date and experience in EMS and/or military.
- Applicants needing an agency match and preceptor assignment shall indicate that need on their paramedic Supplemental Information Form.
  - All applicant-agency matching of those who are not employed in the NWC EMSS shall be done ONLY through the PM Program after prospective students are rank ordered for acceptance.
- Prospective students are NOT to call EMS agencies seeking an affiliation.
- Class selection is slated to occur during the last week of June 2025.

#### **Important Admission Notes**

- An acceptance email will be sent to the applicant at the e-mail address provided on the application as well as to their Harper e-mail address (check spam folders of personal e-mail addresses)
- Applicants who are offered enrollment will be given <u>one week</u> to accept their seat in the class.
  They are considered paramedic student *candidates* only, until all final acceptance requirements
  have been satisfied. Failure to accept their seat by the listed deadline will negate the acceptance
  letter offer and release that seat to the next person on the waiting list.
- Unaffiliated candidates who require a match with an Agency are *conditionally* accepted, subject to a final match proposed by the Paramedic Program and accepted by an approved Agency administrator (Chief/EMS CEO). Individual agency members cannot agree to host a student.
- Applicants are required to meet current admission requirements and follow the Program curriculum as defined at the time of acceptance and as modified by changes in national, state, and/or Program standards that may occur while classes are in session.
- PM student candidates are required to provide evidence of health insurance coverage and to successfully complete all health clearance requirements which include passing a physical exam attesting to their physical, psychological, social, and emotional ability meet the essential job functions of an EMS Clinician as listed in the student handbook and to participate in all class activities without impairment or restriction throughout the class. Very limited accommodations are available to paramedic students as they must fully demonstrate the ability to perform competently in class meeting the essential job functions in the same manner as they would be expected to perform on duty in a hospital and/or at an EMS agency. The functional job description is provided by the NCH Paramedic Program office.

- Students must also meet all immunization requirements by deadlines set by the Program, or
  they will forfeit their seat in the class. In addition, enrollment into the PM Program is contingent
  upon the results of the criminal background check that meets the requirements in the Illinois
  EMS Act and Rules, and a clean drug screen that meets Federal and Program requirements.
  Information regarding these requirements will be provided following Program acceptance.
- Enrolled students will be required to sign a Student Agreement, Academic Release form, Photo Release Form, Invasive Procedure Release Form, and an Emergency Preparedness Exercise participant release form on the day of Program orientation.
- Applicants not accepted into the program who wish to be considered for the following year must reapply.
