Associate in Arts – Humanities Sample Plan

Transfer & Career Notes

Humanities programs include coursework in disciplines such as art and architectural history, communication, history, linguistics, literature, and philosophy. Students may work with advisors to design their own programs.

Some schools offer humanities within their programs of interdisciplinary or general studies. In some graduate degree programs, humanities require an emphasis on art & architectural history, communication, history, linguistics, literature, and philosophy.

Many colleges and universities offer bachelors, masters, and doctoral degrees in humanities. Most two-year colleges offer the first two years of study. Students can often transfer these credits to a four-year school. Master's degrees typically take five or six years of full-time study after high school. Doctoral degree programs typically take three to five years after the master's degree

Suggested Courses

This sample transfer planning guide meets the requirements of the Fall 2016 AA degree. Transfer institution requirements may vary - students should check individual college/university requirements before completing the sample plan as outlined. Baccalaureate admission may be competitive; completion of these courses alone does not guarantee admission.

Requirements for schools vary. Students should check the individual school requirements before completing the curriculum as outlined.

Mathematics

Approved courses are listed with the requirements for the associate degrees. See Group 2 - Mathematics - in the AA Degree.	3
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Physical & Life Sciences

Select one physical and one life science course. At least one must include a lab. Approved courses are listed with the requirements for the associate degrees. See Group 3 - Physical and Life Sciences - in the AA Degree.	7
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Humanities & Fine Arts

Select one course from humanities and one from fine arts. Interdisciplinary courses may count in either category. Approved courses are listed with the requirements for the Associate degrees. Recommended: HUM 101, HUM 102, and advanced literature courses. See Group 4-Humanities and Fine Arts-in the AA Degree	9
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For students following the 2005-2006 catalog or later, one course from humanities and fine arts or social and behavioral sciences must meet the world cultures and diversity requirement.

Social & Behavioral Sciences

Approved courses are listed with the requirements for the associate degrees. See Group 5 - Social & Behavioral Sciences - in the AA Degree.	9
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For students following the 2005-2006 catalog or later, one course from humanities and fine arts or social and behavioral sciences must meet the world cultures and diversity requirement.
