The information on this sheet is subject to frequent change; students should contact the four-year school to keep informed of changes. Final responsibility for verifying all transfer information lies with the student.

TRANSFER OPTIONS

Complete AA or AS* Degree

Students planning on transferring to DePaul University who complete the AA or AS* degree can benefit from the Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI). By completing Harper's 1998 or later AA or AS* degree with a 2.0 GPA in Groups 1-5, DePaul's general education requirements will be considered met. Individual majors may have additional prerequisites and/or requirements that are not covered by this agreement. In addition DePaul has specific mission-related courses that are not covered by this agreement.

Transfer without completing AA or AS* Degree

Students who choose to transfer prior to completing an AA or AS* degree can still benefit from Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI) by completing Groups 1-5 of the AA or AS* with a cumulative 2.0 GPA. This completes the General Education Core Curriculum (GECC) which will meet DePaul's general education requirements. Individual majors may have additional prerequisites and/or requirements that are not covered by this agreement. In addition DePaul has specific mission-related courses that are not covered by this agreement.

Students who do not complete the AA or AS* or the GECC will need to meet DePaul's general education requirements. See the transfer grid on page 4 of this guide.

* On September 18, 2015 the Illinois Community College Board approved the changes to the AS degree. The changes are effective beginning with the 2016-2017 academic year. The new AS model requires fewer humanities and fine arts and social and behavioral sciences and requires additional mathematics and science. Effective the 2016/2017 catalog the AS will no longer include the IAI GECC package. Students who complete the AS degree will need to take the additional humanities and fine arts and social behavior science at DePaul.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR TRANSFER STUDENTS

Transfer applicant must be in good standing at the last college attended. For admission consideration, the College of Liberal Arts & Social Sciences, the College of Communication, the College of Computing & Digital Cinema and the School of Theater require a 2.0 GPA based on transferable courses.

For admission consideration, the Driehaus College of Business, the College of Education and the School of Music require a 2.5 GPA.

Transfer applicants (under 24 years old) with fewer than 30 transferable semester hours should be qualified to meet freshman admission standards.

TRANSFER GUIDES **IMPORTANT INFORMATION******

The transfer course grids found on the last 5 pages of this guide are **only a sample** of the general education courses that transfer to DePaul and fulfill DePaul's general education requirements.

TRANSFER CREDIT

Transfer of credit is awarded on a course-by-course basis. Up to 66 semester hours of transfer credit from two year schools is usable towards a DePaul degree (including CLEP, International Baccalaureate, and/or AP credits).

The last 60 quarter hours of a DePaul degree must be earned in residency at the university and at least half of the major field coursework must be DePaul University credit.

Grades of "D" are usable towards some degree requirements. Exceptions include ENG 101 and 102, any core business courses for the College of Commerce, and any major level courses, all of which must be earned with a C or better to meet degree requirements.

DAPP (DEPAUL ADMISSION PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM)

DAPP (DePaul Admission Partnership Program) is a partnership between DePaul University and Harper College that allows students to begin their bachelor's degree at Harper. DAPP participants meet regularly with DePaul transfer admission counselors and attend special events for transfer students. Students will be map out their entire degree plan, which will stay with them even after they transfer, ensuring they are on the right track. FOREIGN LANGUAGE

All programs leading toward a Bachelor of Arts degree at DePaul have a foreign language requirement of two years of a language in high school or one year at the college level.

COURSE SEQUENCING

Due to DePaul being on a quarter system students are recommended to complete all sequence courses at the same institution.

- Biology (BIO 110 and 140)
- Chemistry (CHM 121 and 122), (CHM 204 and 205)
- Math (MTH 200 and 201)

Students are encouraged to apply early. If interested in housing or financial aid applicants should apply by February 1. Allow at least three weeks for processing of the application. The Theatre School and School of Music applicants must apply by January 15, for fall entrance only and must pass an audition to warrant further consideration.

Housing Priority Date: Gain acceptance to the university before March 1st.

CALCULATION OF ADMISSION GRADE POINT AVERAGE

In computing GPA, only courses comparable to those offered at DePaul are included. Only the most recent attempt of a repeated course is considered. After one term an incomplete grade is computed as a failure.

TRANSFER SCHOLARSHIPS

Students may only receive one type of transfer scholarship from DePaul and should submit the scholarship application prior to April 1. In order to receive consideration for scholarships, students must be admitted by April 1st. Below please find a list of DePaul Scholarships:

- Transfer Academic Scholarship: 3.5-4.0 GPA-\$4000-\$7,000/year (renewable)
- DAPP Scholarship: 3.0 GPA and participate in DAPP-\$2,000/year
- Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship: 3.5-4.0 GPA-\$4,000-\$7,000/year (renewable)
- Mayors Leadership Award: Based upon community service, civil activity and financial need \$2,500-\$5,000/year (renewable)
