TRANSFER OPTIONS

Complete the AA or AS degree before transfer

By completing the degree, students will benefit from the Compact Agreement with ISU.

- Students will be granted automatic junior standing upon admission
- General education requirements for ISU will be considered met

Students must meet admission requirements listed in *Admission Requirements* section. Individual majors may have additional prerequisites and/or GPA requirements that are not covered by this agreement. Transfer without completing AA or AS Degree

Students who choose to transfer prior to completing an AA or AS degree can still benefit from Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI) by completing Groups 1-5 of the AA or AS with a cumulative 2.0 GPA. This completes the General Education Core Curriculum (GECC) which will meet ISU's general education requirements.

Students who do not complete the AA or AS or the GECC will need to meet ISU's general education requirements. See the transfer grid on page 4 of this guide. Students who have earned 30 hours of transferable credit and are IAI eligible may have the option to complete the GECC after transfer, instead of ISU's general education requirements. Students should check with an ISU advisor to determine the best option.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR TRANSFER STUDENTS

In making admission decisions, Illinois State takes the following into consideration:

Transfer students with 24 or more completed semester hours at the time of application

- Cumulative college grade point average and, for some academic programs, prerequisite college course work.
- Applicants must be in good academic standing at the last institution attended

Transfer students with fewer than 24 completed semester hours at the time of application

- Cumulative college grade point average, and, for some academic programs, prerequisite college coursework, in addition to your high school transcript (grade trends and rigor of courses completed), class rank, grade point average, and ACT/SAT scores.
- Applicants must be in good academic standing at the last institution attended

Transfer students should also complete ENG 101, ENG 102, SPE 101 and a Math course (see last page for course selection) prior to transferring to ISU

Highest priority is given to those students with strong academic records and those who achieve an AA or AS Degree. Of those transfer students admitted for 2010-2011, the average GPA was a 3.1 on a 4.0 scale.

RETURNING ISU STUDENTS

Undergraduate students who have previously attended Illinois State University and have been away for at least one semester (not including summer) should check with the Office of Enrollment Management and Academic Services at <http://admissions.illinoisstate.edu/returning> for specific information about reapplying for admission.

FOREIGN LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT

Transfer students are encouraged to complete foreign language graduation requirements prior to attending Illinois State University.

All graduates in the College of Arts and Sciences must satisfy a foreign language requirement that may be met by:

- Three years of one language in high school
- Completion of a second semester or higher of a college level foreign language with a grade of C or better
- American Sign Language may be used to fulfill this requirement by transfer credit

All students pursuing a Bachelor of Arts degree in any program will require knowledge of a foreign language as demonstrated by successful completion of the third level of college credit (LAN 115 at ISU) or can be met by course proficiency test. This includes students in the College of Arts and Sciences. Completion of three years in high school has no bearing on their requirement.

ADDITION INFORMATION FOR BUSINESS, NURSING AND EDUCATION MAJORS

Students planning on majoring in Business, Nursing or Education should consult the Business Packet or the Nursing Packet or the Education Packet found at www.harpercollege.edu/transfer for additional transfer requirements.

TRANSFER CREDIT

ISU will accept a maximum of 70 credit hours from a two-year community college.

Native Illinois State students cannot retake a course at Harper that was originally failed at ISU and then transfer it back to count for major or prerequisite credit. Students who leave ISU and take classes at Harper and plan to return to ISU without an Associate degree should not follow the courses on the back of this guide.

CALCULATION OF ADMISSION GRADE POINT AVERAGE

For Summer 2005 and beyond: Developmental coursework will not be used in calculating the admission GPA. In addition, only the last repeated grade will be used in the admission GPA for repeated courses.

**Spring Admission is not available for transfer students with fewer than 24 semester hours completed at the time of enrollment.

TRANSFER SCHOLARSHIPS

ISU offers the Community College Transfer Scholarship Program. This is a competitive scholarship with awards valued at \$3000 (\$750 per semester for two years.) One award is reserved for a member of Phi Theta Kappa. In order to be considered for this scholarship, candidates must meet the following requirements:

- Earn a cumulative GPA of 3.5 (A=4.0)
- Complete the AA or AS degree by the time of enrollment at ISU
- Be must be first-time community college transfer students at Illinois State.

Students will need to be admitted by March 1st Invitations are automatically mailed out to qualified candidates during the month of March. A 500 word essay and a current transcript must be submitted online along with the scholarship application.

Illinois State University Transfer Guide

Below is the Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI) General Education Core Curriculum, (Groups 1-5 of Harper's 1998 or later AA/AS degree). By completing this core, students will have met the general education requirements of ISU. Individual majors may require additional course work for admission and/or additional general education course work for graduation. Students transferring with the IAI General Education Core must still fulfill the requirement in gray. Final decisions regarding the acceptance of credit rest with Illinois State University.

Must be completed with a 2.0 GPA in the Core courses to be eligible for certification on transcript.
