Northwestern University School of Continuing Studies enrolls approximately 1,100 students in part-time, evening undergraduate and graduate programs.

Transfer Admission Requirements

- Transfer students must have an official high school diploma and be in good academic standing.
- Transfer students must have completed a minimum of 24 semester hours or 36 quarter hours of transferable credit within the past 10 years; a minimum GPA of 3.0 must have been earned in the most recently completed 24 semester hours.
 - *Students who have been out of school for more than 10 years or fall below the 3.0 GPA requirement may be considered for Performance-Based Admission (PBA). PBA students are permitted to transfer credits into their SCS degree program. Please visit the SCS web site for additional information:

- Transfer students must have completed transferable courses in at least three of the following distribution areas: humanities, social sciences, business, communication studies, computer studies and the sciences.

Transfer Credit

Students approved for Performance-Based Admission or Transfer Admission may transfer in up to half of their SCS degree requirements. All previously completed courses will be evaluated for transfer credit, regardless of how long ago the courses were completed. Only courses with grades of "C" or higher are examined for transfer.

Financial Aid & Scholarship Information

Transfer and Performance-Based Admission students are eligible for financial aid. All financial aid applicants must complete the FAFSA. The school code is 001739. Admitted students are eligible to apply for SCS student scholarships.
