THIS TRANSFER GUIDE CONTAINS IMPORTANT TRANSFER INFORMATION THAT CAN IMPACT A STUDENT'S ABILITY TO TRANSFER AND COMPLETE THEIR STUDIES IN A TIMELY MANNER.

The information on this sheet is subject to frequent change; students should contact the four-year school to keep informed of changes. Final responsibility for verifying all transfer information lies with the student.

TRANSFER OPTIONS

Complete AA or AS* Degree

Students planning on transferring to Southern Illinois University who complete the AA or AS* degree can benefit from the Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI). By completing Harper's 1998 or later AA or AS* degree with a 2.0 GPA in Groups 1-5, SIU's general education requirements will be considered met.

Individual majors may have additional prerequisites and/or requirements that are not covered by this agreement.

Transfer without completing AA or AS Degree

Students who choose to transfer prior to completing an AA or AS* degree can still benefit from Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI) by completing Groups 1-5 of the AA or AS* with a cumulative 2.0 GPA. This completes the General Education Core Curriculum (GECC) which will meet SIU's general education requirements.

Students who do not complete the AA or AS or the GECC will need to meet SIU's general education requirements. See the transfer grid on page 5 of this guide. Students who have earned 30 hours of transferable credit toward the IAI GECC may have the option to complete the GECC after transfer, instead of SIU's general education requirements. Students should check with an SIU advisor to determine the best option.

* On September 18, 2015 the Illinois Community College Board approved the changes to the AS degree. The changes are effective beginning with the 2016-2017 academic year. The new AS model requires fewer humanities and fine arts and social and behavioral sciences and requires additional mathematics and science. Effective the 2016/2017 catalog the AS will no longer include the IAI GECC package. **Although the AS no longer includes the IAI GECC, SIU will accept the AS in the same manner as the AA.**

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR TRANSFER STUDENTS

Students with 26 transferable hours or more need:

- Cumulative GPA of 2.0/4.0 for all post-secondary work as calculated by SIU
- Must be eligible to continue enrollment at the last institution attended (not on suspension)

Students with less than 26 transferable hours need:

- Cumulative GPA 2.0/4.0 as calculated by SIU
- Must be eligible to continue enrollment at the last institution attended (not on suspension)
- Must submit high school transcript and ACT and meet freshman admission requirements. These students are reviewed on a case by case basis.

ADDITION INFORMATION FOR BUSINESS, ENGINEERING AND EDUCATION MAJORS

ADDITIONAL PROGRAM INFORMATION

College of Education and Human Services

- Elementary Education is a large major at SIU. It is very important that students have all application materials into Undergraduate Admissions and the Teacher Education Program as far in advance as possible.
- Students must pass the Test of Academic Proficiency or ACT + Writing with a score of 22 or higher on the with at least a 19 or higher in combined English/Writing (for test dates prior to September 1, 2015) or at least a 16 in Writing (for test dates September 1, 2015 or later)
- Students must have an overall grade point average of at least 2.75 (4.0 scale) to be admitted.
- Complete ENG 101 and 102
- Students must have a minimum of 30 semester hours of completed college work prior to admission.
- Teacher candidates must receive a grade of C or better in all education courses and all courses in one's major and endorsement area(s) to receive recommendation for entitlement to teacher licensure.
- Admission to the College of Education and Human Services does not guarantee admission to the Teacher Education Program. ALL teacher candidates seeking state teacher licensure must first be admitted to the Teacher Education Program.
- Special Education requires a total of 128 hours for graduation with 71 of these hours completed at SIU. This usually means that a student will spend two and one-half years at SIU after community college. It can be done in two years if a student is willing to start in the summer.

FOREIGN LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT

Students in the College of Liberal Arts must satisfy the foreign language graduation requirement by having a minimum of one year (two semesters) or higher of one foreign language. The requirement can be satisfied by college coursework or exam. Students pursuing the Bachelor of Fine Arts in Musical Theater or Art, the Bachelor of Music, or the Bachelor of Arts in Music Business are exempt from this requirement.

INTERNATIONAL COURSEWORK REQUIREMENT (COLLEGE OF LIBERAL ARTS ONLY)

Students in the College of Liberal Arts must successfully complete 2 courses providing a global or comparative perspective prior to graduation. Courses can be completed prior to transfer or once the student is enrolled at SIU. The following Harper College courses will meet the requirement:

ANT 101, 202, 205; ART 130, 132; GEG 100, 101, 103, 104, 210; HST 141, 142, 245; PSC 250, 280; SOC 120

Students pursuing the Bachelor of Fine Arts in Musical Theater or Art, the Bachelor of Music, or the Bachelor of Arts in Music Business are exempt from this requirement.

DUAL ADMISSION PROGRAM (DAP)

The Dual Admission Program is intended for students who plan to start at the community college and then transfer to SIU. The program helps students prepare to transfer to SIU and make a smooth transition.

To Qualify for DAP

- Have at least 2 semesters (minimum 30 semester hours) remaining at community college
- Meet admission requirements for SIU and maintain at least a 2.0 cumulative GPA
- Attend an Illinois Community College (or eligible Missouri or Kentucky community college)
- Declare a specific major at SIU

CAPSTONE OPTION

If you are graduating from a two-year occupational program or with an Associate in Applied Science degree, you can be considered for the Capstone Option, which offers transfer students an opportunity to build on already marketable occupational skills. Capstone reduces the University Core Curriculum (UCC) requirement from 41 to 30 semester hours. Go to <http://transfer.siu.edu/capstone/> for more information.

TRANSFER CREDIT

SIU has no ceiling on the number of credit hours that can be transferred and evaluated toward degree requirements. Community college students are affected only by the requirement that 42 hours of the degree must be earned at the 300-400 level from a four-year institution and that the last 30 semester hours of an SIUC degree be earned at SIUC.

CALCULATION OF ADMISSION GRADE POINT AVERAGE

The calculation method used to determine the GPA depends on when the courses were taken.

If Courses Taken Summer 2013 or later

- Only the last grade earned in a repeated course will be calculated in the GPA even if it is an F grade. The repeated course must be done in the same institution and can only be taken two times.

If Courses Taken Summer 2003 through Spring 2013

- All earned grades are calculated into the GPA, including each earned grade in all repeated courses.

If Courses Taken Summer 1996 through Spring 2003

- Only the last grade earned in a repeated course will be calculated in the GPA even if it is an F grade. The repeated course must be done in the same institution.

If Courses Taken Prior to Summer 1996

- All earned grades are calculated into the GPA, including each earned grade in all repeated courses.

If a student has earned an AA or AS degree from Harper, and SIU's grading calculations cause the student's GPA to fall below a 2.0, he or she will still be admitted to the University as long as the student has not taken any additional college work since graduating from Harper.

APPLICATION DEADLINES

The application process should be started as early as possible.

Fall: Priority Deadline is December 1

Final Deadline is May 1

Applications may be accepted after these dates on a space-available basis. Several programs require application one year in advance.

TRANSFER SCHOLARSHIPS

Chancellor's Transfer Scholarship

- 3.5 GPA and Associate's degree
- Full tuition and mandatory fees for 2 years
- Must have admission application completed by November 1st and Scholarship application by December 1st

Dean's Transfer Scholarship

- 3.5 and minimum 30 transferable hours
- \$2,500/year for up to 2 years
- Must maintain 3.0 GPA at SIU

Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship

- 3.5 GPA and minimum 30 transferable hours
- Must be a member of PTK for one academic year
- \$500 one time award

ARTICULATION

The Associate in Arts and Associate in Science degrees from Harper College will fulfill the University Core Curriculum requirements required for general graduation purposes at SIU.
