The information on this sheet is subject to frequent change; students should contact the four-year school to keep informed of changes. Final responsibility for verifying all transfer information lies with the student.

TRANSFER OPTIONS

Complete AA or AS Degree

Students planning on transferring to the University of Illinois at Springfield who complete the AA or AS degree can benefit from the Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI). By completing Harper's 1998 or later AA or AS degree with a 2.0 GPA in Groups 1-5, UIS's general education requirements will be considered met.

Individual majors may have additional prerequisites and/or requirements that are not covered by this agreement.

Transfer without completing AA or AS Degree

Students who choose to transfer prior to completing an AA or AS degree can still benefit from Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI) by completing Groups 1-5 of the AA or AS with a cumulative 2.0 GPA. This completes the General Education Core Curriculum (GECC) which will meet UIS's general education requirements.

Students who do not complete the AA or AS or the GECC will need to meet UIS's general education requirements. See the transfer grid on page 3 of this guide.

UIS is a participant in the Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI). Students who complete the AA or AS degree prior to transfer or who complete the IAI GECC should make sure to inform their advisor at UIS. Students who have earned 30 hours of transferable credit to UIS and are IAI eligible may have the option to complete the GECC after transfer, instead of UIS's general education requirements. Students should check with a UIS advisor to determine the best option.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR TRANSFER STUDENTS

- Transfer students must have 30 semester hours completed and a cumulative GPA of 2.0 based on all work attempted. Transfer students are encouraged to complete 39 hours prior to transfer.
- Students with less than 30 hours of transfer credit should apply as a freshman and must meet freshman admissions requirements. They must also submit official transcripts from all colleges and universities attended.
- Graduates of regionally accredited community colleges holding an associate of arts or associate of science transfer degrees are considered to have met all general education requirements.

TRANSFER CREDIT

A maximum of 72 credit hours from a community college will be accepted. However, typically no more than 60 hours will be applied towards a degree. Program prerequisites with grades of “D” are acceptable as long as the cumulative GPA is 2.0 or higher.

APPLICATION DEADLINES

There is no application deadline for admission to UIS. However, some programs may have a deadline. Students are encouraged to contact the University for specific information regarding program deadlines.
