The Bachelor of Science in Health Care Leadership, an online accelerated adult degree completion program, is for those students who have completed an associate’s degree, have health care certification, registration or licensure, who are currently employed in supporting health care roles, or who wish to seek a supportive position in health care. It provides students with an opportunity to enrich their knowledge and skills in the fast-growing field of health care.

Admission Requirements

The following are required for admission into the Health Care Leadership Program:

- A minimum of 64 semester hours of transfer credit or an associate’s degree
- A minimum 2.0 cumulative G.P.A.
- Completion of the admission application process
- A maximum of 80 s.h. will transfer from any community college

A total of 128 semester hours is required to earn a bachelor’s degree with a minimum of 32 semester hours taken through USF. The number of semester hours needed to complete the program depends on the number of transferable credits towards the degree and credit earned through the Prior Learning Assessment Program for college-level learning experienced outside the traditional classroom (if applicable).
