Mr. Cunningham defined some of the activities and "hidden duties" connected with teaching. He discussed the staff needs and long-term projections of future programs for the Engineering Division.

Vice-Chairman Hansen, on behalf of the Board, thanked Mr. Cunningham and his staff for a very fine presentation.

It was agreed to have this type of discussion at a future meeting.

Report Concerning the Status of the Maine Township Community College Study Committee Dr. Lahti reported he had discussed the status of the Maine Township Community College Study Committee with the Superintendent of Maine Township High School, Richard Short. Superintendent Short indicated this committee has expressed an interest in joining with Niles and also has reviewed the possibility of joining with Harper College.

After discussion, the Board requested the administration to make recommendations to the Board in connection with this move--concerning our tax base, Harper's possible revenue, the necessity of immediately looking for another campus, additional costs which might be involved, capital expenditures, and the kind of programs possible.

After further discussion, the Board of Trustees asked Dr. Lahti to indicate open-mindedness on the part of the Harper Board towards the possibility of this group joining with Harper College; to explore the open-mindedness of this committee towards joining with Harper. If there is open-mindedness on the part of the committee, Dr. Lahti was asked to present the Board with information relative to the above recommendations.
