

# Quick Guide

# Admissions, Advising and Registration



### **NEW students**

You are a New Student if you have not previously been admitted to and have never been enrolled in credit courses at Harper College. You will need to complete an application for admission before you register. Applications are available online, in the Admissions Office, New Student Services and Art Center, C101, or by calling 847.925.6700.

#### STEP 1

Complete the application for admission, and submit it and a \$25 nonrefundable fee to the Harper College Admissions Office. Degree-seeking students are also required to submit an official high school transcript or GED results and official transcripts from each college attended. (Non-degree-seeking students are not required to provide transcripts.)

#### STEP 2

You are encouraged to attend a new student advising session. These small group sessions last about one and one-half hours and will give you information about Harper College programs, services, admission requirements and registration procedures. They also include an opportunity for each group member to speak with an advisor regarding course selection. Call 847.925.6208 to reserve a seat and/or to get more information. Morning, afternoon and evening sessions are available. (You can access new student information online at harpercollege.edu. Click on Advising/Counseling, then Center for New Students and Orientation.)

#### STEP 3

If you plan to enroll in your first college level English and/or math course, you must take computerized writing, reading and/or math assessment tests. Test results determine your placement in those courses and must be completed prior to registration. You may be eligible for a waiver of testing with appropriate ACT scores and/or college transcripts. Contact the Center for New Students and Orientation at 847.925.6208, or the Assessment and Testing Center at 847.925.6541 for details.

#### STEP 4

Select class times and sign up for classes. New students can enroll in courses via the Web, by touchtone or in person. See page 5 for registration options and instructions.

#### STEP 5

Pay tuition and fees by the due date given to you at the time of registration.

If you apply to Harper for the summer session and plan to continue full time in the fall, please contact the Center for New Students and Orientation to make sure you're invited to an orientation program which will include assessment testing, essential new student information, one-on-one counseling and registration.

## Currently and previously enrolled credit students

As a previously enrolled student, you have already submitted an application, been admitted to and enrolled in a credit class at Harper College. You do not need to reapply.

#### STEP 1

You are encouraged to schedule an appointment in one of the academic advising centers for individualized academic advising, educational planning, information on transferring to another institution and/or to determine which catalog edition to follow. Call 847.925.6393 or 847.925.6522 for an appointment. (If you are blocked from registration because of academic standing, you must see a counselor before your registration will be unblocked.)

#### STEP 2

If you plan to enroll in your first college-level English and/or math course, you must take the writing, reading and/or math assessment tests. Test results determine your placement in those courses and must be completed prior to registration. You may be eligible for a waiver of testing with appropriate ACT scores and/or college transcripts. Contact one of the academic advising centers at 847.925.6393 or 925.6522 or the Assessment and Testing Center at 847.925.6541 for details.

#### STEP 3

Select class times and register. Currently and previously enrolled Harper College students can enroll in courses via the Web, by touchtone or in person. See page 5 for registration options and instructions.

#### STEP 4

Pay tuition and fees by the due date given to you at the time of registration.

# Things you should know

#### **College Hours**

Admissions Outreach is open from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. Monday through Thursday; 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Friday; 9 a.m. to 12 p.m. Saturday. Other College offices are open for business Monday through Thursday, from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. and Friday from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. For extended hours please check the Web site: harpercollege.edu

#### **Summer Hours**

The College is closed Friday, Saturday and Sunday from June 11—August 15.

#### **Cancellations**

The College reserves the right to withdraw any section of any course if enrollment is not sufficient to warrant offering that section. An effort is made to reach students with information on cancellations.

#### **Eligibility for Admission**

All high school graduates or the equivalent are eligible for admission to the College. Non-high school graduates, home schooled students who have not completed their program and students still enrolled in high school are welcome to participate in College offerings under certain conditions. Please contact the Admissions Outreach Office at 847.925.6506 for more information.

#### Residency

A student who has resided within the State of Illinois and the Harper College district 30 days immediately prior to the start of the term is eligible to be classified as an in-district student for purposes of calculating appropriate tuition rate.

Proof of in-district status is **required** at the time of registration. Proof can include driver's license, voters registration card, check book, library card, lease, utilify bill or tax bill.

#### **Testing**

Assessment testing is required of all new full-time students and any student entering his or her first college level English or math course and must be completed prior to registration. The full assessment includes writing, reading and math testing, and it will take approximately two hours to complete. Photo identification is required. Please check the Guide to Student Services for the Assessment and Testing Center hours.

#### **Limited Enrollment Programs**

To be considered for admission to certain career programs applicants are required to fulfill specific requirements in addition to being admitted to the College. Admission is competitive. Contact Admissions Outreach, 847.925.6707, for details. These limited enrollment programs are Cardiac Technology, Cardiographic Technician, Dental Hygiene, Diagnostic Medical Sonography, Electrocardiograph Technician, Emergency Medical Technician-Paramedic, Emergency Medical Technician-Basic, Mammography, Nursing (RN and LPN), Certified Nursing Assistant, Phlebotomy, Radiologic Technology and Vascular Technologist. Some courses and sections which are offered only to students in limited enrollment programs are not listed in this course schedule.

#### **Auditing a Course**

A student who wishes to audit a course will be required to pay full tuition and fees and must obtain approval from the instructor, department chair or dean before enrolling in the class. Registration for audit status may be completed only during final registration (the first week of classes) and must be the original enrollment in the class. Students taking the class for credit are given priority. Status changes from credit to audit are not permitted.

## Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI)

If you are a new student starting at Harper summer 1998 or later, you may be eligible to participate in a state-wide agreement called the Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI) designed to help Illinois college students transfer easily. Eligible students who earn the AA or AS degree at Harper will have completed a General Education Core Curriculum which is transferrable to more than 100 participating Illinois colleges and universities. If you are not looking to earn a degree before transfer, you can complete just the Core Curriculum at Harper and know that your general education courses will transfer to the other participating colleges and universities. #### College Credit from Other Institutions

Students seeking a certificate or degree from Harper College and wanting to transfer credits from another college should complete a Transcript Evaluation form in the Registrar's Office, Building A, Room A213. Students must have an official transcript from each college attended sent to Harper College's Admissions Processing, Building A, Room A137c.

Students wishing to use previous college level math, English, and other credits to fulfill Harper course prerequisites must bring transcripts or grade reports to registration and to the first day of class. Students do not need to request an evaluation for this purpose. Questions about previous college courses can be directed to the Registrar's Office, 847.925.6500.

#### **Hope Tax Credit**

For the first two years of college, you or your parents can claim a new nonrefundable 100 percent tax credit up to \$1500 of tuition and fees per year. This tax credit allows you to claim tuition and fee expenses if you enroll in a degree or certificate program for at least six credit hours.

#### **Lifetime Learning Tax Credit**

This credit will be permitted for subsequent education. This is a tax credit up to \$1000 of direct educational expenses paid. Other tax benefits may be available to students and families. For more information on these tax benefits, see the U.S. Department of Education's Families Guide to the 1997 Tax Cuts for Education (www.ed.gov/updates/97918tax.html) or the IRS Web site.

#### **Senior Citizen Discount**

This discount is available to district residents 60 years of age and older. They will be assessed a 50 percent tuition to credit courses that are dedicated specifically to senior citizens. District residents age 65 years of age and older are eligible for a 100 percent discount for all credit courses during late registration. Late registration is the first day of the term or the first day of the sension in which the class meets. This must be the student's initial enrollment in the class and there must be space available. Students may not drop and reenroll for the discount.

#### **Education Service Agreement**

Businesses within the Harper College district can now offer Harper in-district tuition rates to full-time employees who live outside the College district but within Illinois. The Educational Services Agreement Program permits employees of indistrict businesses to attend Harper classes at indistrict prices if their employers have registered for this free program. The in-district tuition is available whether the cost is to be paid by the employee or by the company. Employers who are interested in this program should contact Admissions Outreach, 847.925.6206.

#### Chargeback/Joint Agreement

Out-of-district students desiring to pursue a certificate or degree program at Harper that is not available at their community college may apply for a chargeback or joint agreement with their community college. If the application is approved, the student will be able to receive in-district rates. For further information, call 847.925.6282.

#### **Special Notes**

Students who are physically disabled should call 847.925.6266 for registration information.

Handicap parking is available for students who have handicap license plates or State of Illinois or township-issued handicap parking cards. For further information contact Health and Psychological Services at 847,925,6268.

#### **Course Outlines**

#### The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974

#### Annual Notice to Students

The following notice and information is given by William Rainey Harper College, District Number 512 to advise its students of their rights under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (The Act)

The Act established the right of students to inspect and review their education records; provides that personally identifiable information will not, with certain exceptions, be disclosed without the student's written permission; provides for guidelines for the correction of inaccurate or misleading data through informal or formal hearings; grants students the right to file complaints with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act Office (FERPA) concerning alleged failures of the College to comply with The Act; and makes provisions for notice to the students concerning their rights.

A student who wishes to review his or her education records must complete the appropriate form and submit it to the Registrar. The student will be notified in writing of a date and time he or she may come to review the records.

The following student data is hereby designated as Directory Information and as such may be disclosed or released by the College for any purpose and at its discretion: Student Name, Home Address, Home Telephone, Major Area of Study, Dates of Attendance, Part-Time/Full-Time Enrollment Status, Degrees/Certificates Earned, Awards Received, Last College Attended, Officially Recognized Activities, Date and Place of Birth, Weights and Heights of Members of Athletic Teams.

To have any or all of the Directory Information withheld, the student must give written notice, in person or by certified mail, return receipt requested and addressed to the Registrar by the first day of each course or program, as the case may be, for which he/she is enrolled.

Harper College has adopted policies and procedures implementing The Act, which are contained in the Harper College Catalog.

Copies of The Act, Harper College policies and procedures, the Harper College Catalog and forms for use in implementing the Act are available on request in the Registrar's Office, Building A, Room A213.

### **Payment Due Dates**

If you register from February 24 through May 9, your payment is due by 8 p.m., May 10, 2005. Students who do not make payment by May 10 will be dropped for non-payment.

## **Dropping Credit Classes**

- To be eligible for a refund, students must withdraw during the refund period specified below. Students may drop one or more classes at the Registrar's Office, Building A, Room A213, or by using Web registration or Touchtone registration (when available).
- The Business Office will disperse refunds by mail. Refunds will be processed by check, or, if payment was by credit card, applied to credit card account. Refunds will normally be processed within 10 business days.

an appointment. The ESL Office starts giving appointments in March. Appointments will only be given to students who have turned in a completed application.

## Adult Educational Development (AED)

The Adult Educational Development (AED) Department offers Basic Skills, Pre-GED, GED, Citizenship Training, Employment Skills and Special Topics courses for persons who are over 16 years of age and who are not currently enrolled in high school. The department offers the Nonnative Literacy Program for persons whose first language is not English. Online classes are available at the GED level. Student placement, achievement, GED predictive and career interest testing and other advising services are also available. Classes are offered free of charge or for a low fee through support of federal and state grant funds.

The GED Testing Program is intended primarily for adults 19 years of age or older; however, students 17 and 18 years of age may test if they meet other eligibility requirements.

Students may register for Basic Skills, Pre-GED, GED, Citizenship and Employment classes at Harper's main campus or the Harper Northeast Center. Registration for Nonnative Literacy classes will be held only at the off-campus location where classes are taught: the Harper Northeast Center, Police Neighborhood Resource Center or the Northeast Palatine Community Center.


