IN-DEPTH COLLECTION INFORMATION

Historical Note: The LRC Liaison (later the Liaison) was a newsletter produced by the Harper College Learning Resources Center (LRC) starting in 1986 and continuing through the mid-to-late-nineties. It covers a dynamic time in the history of the LRC when card catalogs and Readers' Guides were in the process of being replaced by Online Public Access Catalogs and library databases. Newsletter articles updated the Harper community on the automation process, and introduced new amenities including new group study rooms (Spring 1988) and parking lot book drops (Fall 1987). The newsletter included articles about additions and updates to the collection, and themed suggested reading book lists. Other articles introduced staff and announced personnel changes in the LRC. Articles like "What is Inter-library Loan?" (December 1994), and "What is Library Technology?" (March 1995) informed readers about library services and resources.

Scope and content: The collection contains bifold newsletters, mostly 4-6 pages in length. The newsletters contain short articles, black-and-white photos, and illustrations. The newsletter articles have updates about the library automation process that was ongoing at the time, in addition to library news, library how-to articles, and staff news and bios.
