C-103. **Please note** that a one-time \$25 non-refundable application fee will need to be paid for the application to be processed.

- Submit Home Schooled documentation
- Submit a copy of the ACT score report (if taken)

This information will be reviewed by a counselor in the Center for New Students and Orientation in order to determine your eligibility to enroll. Additional information and/or a meeting with a counselor in the Center for New Students may be necessary before a final admission determination can be made.
