ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

COLUMBIA COLLEGE AND HARPER COLLEGE

I. COLUMBIA COLLEGE

Columbia College offers numerous baccalaureate degree programs, which are all included in this agreement.

II. TRANSFER OF CREDIT

A. Credit Hours

At least 39 hours must be taken at the upper level to receive a bachelor degree; the remaining hours can be completed with Columbia College, Harper College, or other transfer work approved by Columbia College. Harper College students must also complete a minimum 24 of the last 60 semester hours with Columbia College courses to satisfy the Columbia College residency requirement.

B. General Education

Columbia College will accept the Harper College Associate in Arts, Associate in Science, Associate in Arts in Teaching and Associate in Engineering Science degrees as satisfying all of the Columbia College general education requirements.

Columbia College will accept the Harper College Associate in Applied Science, Associate in General Studies, Associate in Fine Arts or any other associate degree not specifically mentioned in this agreement as satisfying all of the Columbia College general education requirements if the student completes the following coursework:

- ENG 101 Composition with a grade of "C" or better
- ENG 102 Composition with a grade of "C" or better
- -At least 27 additional semester hours that meet the Columbia College requirement in the Humanities, Social/Behavioral Science and Math/ Science areas with at least one course in each area.

C. Individual Courses

Transfer credits earned at Harper College and other accredited institutions of higher education will be evaluated individually by the Columbia College Evaluations Office. Columbia College will provide a Course Equivalency Guide to Harper College's academic advisors and administrators. Any courses taken at Harper College for which the student earned a grade of "C" or better will be accepted for transfer to Columbia College, and will be granted the Columbia College equivalency listed on the Course Equivalency Guide provided.

D. Dual Enrollment

Students who complete an approved associate degree with Harper College at any time during their pursuit of a Bachelor degree with Columbia College are eligible for the general education waiver. Students who complete any other Associate degree with Harper College during their pursuit of a Bachelor degree with Columbia College may complete additional course work to fulfill the general education requirements, outlined in Section B. Once all the general education waiver requirements are met and the associate degree is awarded, the student will be eligible for the general education waiver. Course work may be completed with Columbia College, Harper College, or any other transfer credit accepted by the Columbia College Evaluations Office.

III. COLUMBIA COLLEGE ADMISSION

Students who complete an associate degree from Harper College will be approved for admission to Columbia College.

IV. DURATION OF AGREEMENT

The agreement will be in effect until either Party issues a letter of intent to cancel the Agreement, with such notification affirmed at least sixty (60) days before the termination date.

V. REVISION OF AGREEMENT

Items not specifically mentioned within this Agreement will be governed by the Columbia College Bulletin. Amendments and/or revisions to the Agreement may be made in writing at anytime by mutual consent of all Parties. Such amendments and/or revisions shall be prepared in the form of an Addendum Agreement. The procedure for approval of such addenda and/or revisions shall follow the same procedure employed in securing approval of all Parties in the original cooperative agreement. Each of the Parties shall work cooperatively to review and to update regularly specific items or operational procedures included in this Agreement.

VI. PUBLICITY

This Agreement will be publicized as a cooperative degree completion program for students of Harper College. Through joint informational meetings and individual counseling by both institutions, both Parties to this Agreement will be responsible for publicizing the terms of this Agreement to their students. Non-degree-seeking students will be subject to the policies and procedures of both institutions. All questions regarding policies and procedures of either institution will be answered by the designated representative of that institution and by reference to the current published Catalog or Bulletin of that institution.
