<sup>1</sup> A "C" or better is required for University Approval to Take Teacher Education courses.

<sup>2</sup> Take the Test of Academic Proficiency and begin the Selection Process for Admission to Teacher Education. Apply to Eastern and have official transcripts sent from high school and college.

<sup>3</sup> Meets the Cultural Diversity Requirement.

<sup>4</sup> Must have passed the Test of Academic Proficiency or have a composite score of a 22 or above on the ACT Plus Writing with a combined English/Writing sub-score of a 19 and earned a "C" or better in ELE 2050.

<sup>5</sup> Must have University Approval to Take Teacher Education courses. See EIU Undergraduate Catalog for requirements.

<sup>6</sup> Can take the equivalency at Harper College to reduce load at EIU. If taken at Harper, a waiver must be approved to count for EDF 2555 for major. Course will not count towards General Education.

**Note 1 – A grade of "C" or better is required in all courses**

**Note 2- Foreign Language is a graduation Requirement. Two full years of high school foreign language with a "C" average or completion of the second semester of a college foreign language will satisfy this requirement.**
