Harper College – Associates in Applied Science in Law Enforcement and Justice Administration to Robert Morris University – <u>Bachelor of Professional Studies in</u> Law Enforcement Administration

This Articulation Agreement is entered into by Robert Morris University and Harper College in order to create a smooth and seamless process by which transfer students will be able to complete a Baccalaureate Degree at Robert Morris University. All policies and procedures of this agreement will be governed by the principles of current established agreements, (Illinois Articulations Initiative,) and benefit afforded transfer students as stated in the Robert Morris University *Undergraduate Catalog* unless there is a joint modification of these agreements. This articulation is intended to foster and promote continued communication between the two institutions in order to develop and perfect additional opportunities for articulated seamless transfer.

Students completing the AAS degree program in Law Enforcement and Justice Administration at Harper College and <u>receiving their Associates in Applied Science degree</u> are eligible to enroll in the Bachelor of Professional Studies program at Junior level status at Robert Morris University to complete their degree in Law Enforcement Administration. Students will make a smooth transition with all credits from the Associates in Applied Science degree being accepted in their entirety.

Students completing the Associates in Applied Science degree, including the recommended courses, can complete their Bachelor's degree at Robert Morris University in as little as 15 months.
